OUR MISSION



To supply the European economy with secondary raw materials and energy, whilst managing waste in a environmentally safe way.



In 2020, the recycling of all waste was approximated at 40% at EU-level.

This was largely equivalent to the waste being sent to landfills and other disposals operations.

At FEAD, we pledge to achieve a 75% target for the recycling of all waste in the EU by 2035.
